- b) Finance Director Solorza gave the Staff Report
- c) Public Input:

Chris Barnes, 4971 Berton Circle, addressed the City Council in support of maintaining the Fit 'n' Fun program at no cost.

Ralph Rodriguez, 4621 Amberwood Avenue, addressed the City Council in support of maintaining the Fit 'n' Fun program at no cost; in support of adopting a bridge approach to budget cuts; and to suggest seeking grant opportunities or other ways of funding before raising fees on recreation programs.

- d) Mayor Hwangbo closed the Public Hearing at 7:57 p.m.
- e) Council Comments and Questions:

Discussion ensued regarding Fit 'n' Fun fees; finding alternatives for funding the program; support for recreation programs; and support for Staff's modifications to the fee schedule.

- f) Provide direction to Staff on outstanding questions from March 5, 2013; with direction being incorporated into the adopted, updated Master Fee Schedules per resolution.

The City Council directed Staff to modify the User Fee Schedule as follows:

Set #1: Burden Rate & Direct Cost

Council Member Charoen made a motion to utilize burden rates of 44% for non-safety and 52% for safety personnel along with current hourly rates.

The motion was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Shanahan.

Council Member Goedhart stated he would be voting against the item because he supports the Alternative Direct Cost method that utilizes the compensation data used in the State Controller's report.

The motion carried on the following vote:

Question 2: Non-Resident fees for Recreation and Community Service Programs

Mayor Pro Tem Shanahan made a motion to approve non-resident fees as Staff recommended; \$5 for youth and adult contract classes up to \$50, \$10 for youth and adult contract classes \$51 or more, and \$15 for direct service programs excluding the Fit 'n' Fun program.

The motion failed for lack of a second.

Council Member Charoen made a motion to approve Staff recommendation of \$5 non-resident fee for youth and adult contract classes up to \$50.

Mayor Hwangbo made a substitute motion to approve Staff recommendation of \$5 non-resident fee for youth and adult contract

classes up to \$50 and \$10 non-resident fee for youth and adult contract classes \$51 and over.

The motion was seconded by Council Member Charoen and carried on the following vote:

Question 3: Water Bill delinquent charge - Increase to \$20, and keep the current amount of \$89 for the Trash Bin in Right of Way encroachment fee.

Mayor Hwangbo made a motion to keep the water delinquent fee at \$10 and the Trash Bin encroachment fee at \$89. The motion failed for lack of a second.

Council Member Goedhart made a motion to increase the water delinquency fee from \$10 to \$20.

The motion was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Shanahan and failed on the following vote:

AYES: Council Member Goedhart, and Mayor Pro Tem Shanahan.

Council Member Charoen made a motion to reconsider.

City Attorney Kuperberg clarified that a motion to reconsider requires a second and a majority vote. If the motion to reconsider is approved the matter is before the body for consideration again.

City Attorney Kuperberg noted that the resolution would approve all the modifications made by the City Council prior to this item; that the City Council could chose to take a straw vote, come to a consensus, or make a formal motion on each item; and amend the resolution to reflect specific items.

Council Member Goedhart made a motion to approve increasing fees for Pee Wee Sports to \$90. The motion was seconded by Mayor Hwangbo and failed on the following vote:

Council Member Goedhart made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2013-14 approving the fee schedule with changes to the following fees (Pee Wee Sports - \$90; Tiny Tots Monday Wednesday Friday- \$140; Tiny Tots Tuesday Thursday - \$100; Day Camps - \$120; Deposits - \$50 for Resident and \$100 for non-residents, \$150 for residents and \$200 for non-residents, \$200 for residents and \$250 for non-residents, \$300 for residents and \$400 for non-residents; no fees for Artificial Turf; and \$75 Administrative Review for Solar. The motion failed for lack of a second.

Council Member Charoen made a motion to approve the Tiny Tots - Tuesday and Thursday fee - from \$99 to \$100 for residents and adding an additional \$15 for non-residents.

Council Member Charoen withdrew his motion.

Mayor Hwangbo made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2013-14 approving and adopting the User Fee Schedule (Exhibit A, Schedules 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5) as so amended, modified, revised, and corrected including those changes directed by the City Council at the March 19, 2013, public hearing; and Adopt Resolution No. 2013-15 approving and adopting a direct cost model, as so amended, modified, revised, and corrected including those changes directed by the City Council at the March 19, 2013, public hearing.

The motion was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Shanahan and failed on the following vote:

City Attorney Kuperberg suggested that the City Council could consider item g) separately from item h).

Discussion ensued regarding clarification of Council Member Goedhart's proposed changes; support for charging non-residents direct cost for direct service programs; that some programs would be eliminated if direct cost was charged; that the Pee-Wee sports participants are 60% resident and 40% non-resident; that the Recreation Department is looking at other alternatives for running Pee-Wee sports; that the City would not be able to control the cost for the Pee-Wee sports program if contracted out; and opposition to a non-resident fee for all the Pee-Wee sports programs.

Council Member Goedhart made a motion to approve a resident fee of \$90 and a \$105 non-resident fee for all the Pee-Wee Sports programs (line items 10, 11, and 12 of exhibit A).

The motion was seconded by Mayor Hwangbo and failed on the following vote:

AYES: Council Member Goedhart and Mayor Hwangbo.

NOES: Council Member Charoen, and Mayor Pro Tem Shanahan.

ABSTAINED: Council Member Kim.

Further discussion ensued regarding how best to come to a consensus; varied levels of support for each fee; that this item reflects the will of the City Council; and the possibility of voting on each line item.

City Attorney Kuperberg reported on the requirements for fees being the cost of service not exceeding the cost of providing that service; that if the City Council approved the item fee by fee, then a resolution for each fee would need to be adopted; and that Staff would need documentation to support the fees for defense purposes.

Council Member Goedhart made a motion to charge \$99 for residents and an additional \$15 for non-residents for all Pee-Wee Sports programs.

The motion was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Shanahan and carried on the following vote:
