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La Palma City Council Adopts 2015 Goals

LA PALMA, Calif. – On January 20, 2015, the La Palma City Council adopted goals for 2015. The eleven goals will be incorporated into the City's budget, labor negotiations processes, department work plans, performance measures, and reporting. Overall, the goals emphasize placing the City on firm financial footing and maintaining the services and quality of life expected by the La Palma community. A brief summary of the City Council goals includes:

- Make a decision regarding the billboard project
- Maintain a sustainable balanced budget
- Study the modernization of the utility users' tax
- Address the water/sewer funds operational deficits
- Maintain quality of life
- Adopt a revised zoning code
- Reduce City water usage by at least 20% by 2020
- Complete labor negotiations for 2015
- Discuss how to move forward on La Palma kids going to school in La Palma
- Promote and achieve a better business environment
- Receive a financing plan for City Hall improvements/replacement
